I worked variously as a field trials biologist, multi-discipline project manager and global product development manager and very much enjoyed being able to travel widely to visit farms and farmers.

For the last 15 years my role was as an Environmental Stewardship manager and as an ecological risk assessor. One key aspect of my environmental stewardship has been in creating projects to enhance farmland landscapes and wildlife biodiversity. Operation Pollinator is the flagship project that we created, it has been fantastic to work with farmers and advisors on this and to see this implemented in agricultural-environment schemes on farms across the UK and Europe. We also developed programmes for biocontrol, farmland birds and Water Friendly Farming. Following my interest in horticulture I was recently appointed to the Royal Horticultural Society science committee.

Plants, nature, wildlife and landscape have always been my passion, and we have visited many areas of natural beauty and wildlife on our holidays. Now as I have retired I intend to devote more time to local wildlife conservation and recording with the SWT. We have been members of the SWT since moving to Surrey 30 years ago. I am also a member of other natural history groups such as the British Trust for Ornithology, Plantlife, the Surrey Botanical Society and the Friends of Normandy Wildlife group. I am active as a recorder and regularly complete wildlife surveys in the area (the Breeding Birds Survey and butterfly survey on Broad Street Common, a plant/vegetation survey for the National Plant Monitoring Scheme on the Pirbright ranges and also a farmland bird survey on farmland near to Hascombe).
