How to make your own:

European nightjar nest!



You will need:

- Nightjar body, wing, and eggs templates
- Cardboard
- Sticky tape and glue
- Scissors
- Pens, pencils, or paint
- Paper plate
- Paper scraps
- Dried grass, twigs, and leaves



Print off and colour in the templates, using pens, pencils, or paint.



Fold along the dashed lines at the bottom of the body and the eggs.

Fun Facts!

- Nightjars are the least fussy nesters; they make their nests directly on the ground.
- Both nightjar chicks and adults have excellent camouflage to protect themselves from predators.
- The scientific name for nightjar: *Caprimulgus,* means goatsucker. This comes from an ancient myth that nightjars sucked milk from goats!



Stick the templates to cardboard, cut along the solid lines.



Tape the body and eggs to the paper plate.







Glue the wing to the body.



Decorate the nest by gluing on paper scraps, grass, twigs, and leaves.
