

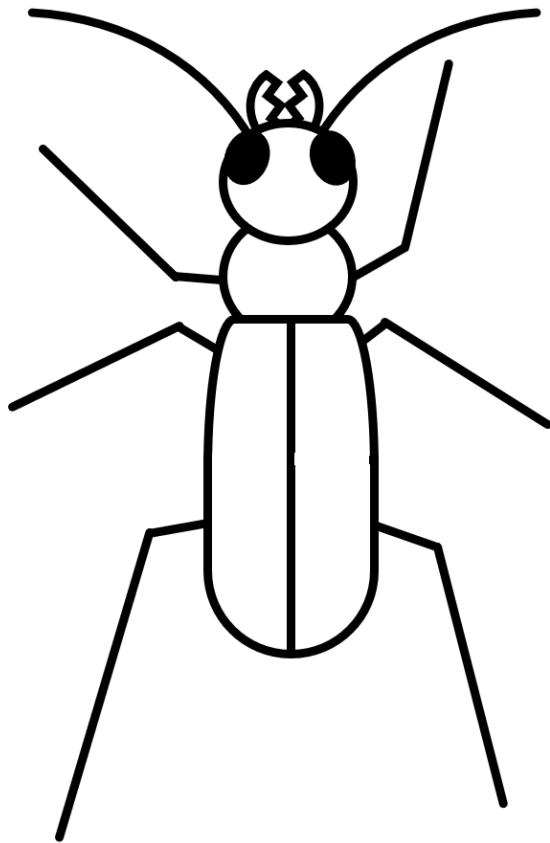
# Green Tiger Beetle Game

All you need is a pen, paper, and a dice



## Throws

- |   |  |

| 1 Eye      | 4 Jaw   |
| 2 Antenna  | 5 Head  |
| 3 Legs     | 6 Body  |

## Game rules

Players take turns to roll the dice. A 6 must be rolled first to make the body, and then the different parts can be added with each roll. A 5 for the head must be rolled before the eyes, jaws, and antennae can be added.

To complete a beetle you need 2 eyes, 2 antennae, 6 legs, 2 jaws, a head, and a body.

The winner of each round is the player who completes their green tiger beetle first!

## Fun Facts!

- Green tiger beetle larvae hide in funnel shaped burrows. When their prey fall in, they drag them down with their powerful jaws!
- The adult green tiger beetle's long legs make them very agile when hunting. They are one of the fastest insects in a sprint!
