The Leader in Outdoor Learning (level 2) course is accredited with Open College Network West Midlands and will guide you through the why and the how of implementing outdoor learning throughout your curriculum. Full of practical ideas and led by experienced outdoor educators, the 3-day course and the accompanying workbook of evidence that you will complete should leave you feeling inspired and prepared to make the most of your school grounds and take lessons outside.

The 1½ day Introduction to Facilitating Outdoor Learning (level 1) course, also accredited with Open College Network West Midlands, includes activity ideas, Q&A opportunities, and some simple written recordings of learning which should help to kick start your outdoor learning journey.

Courses



Introduction to Facilitating Outdoor Learning (Level 1)

This course is accredited by Open College Network and is designed to introduce attendees to the world of outdoor learning.

Course Description

1½ day course introducing the following concepts:

- Benefits of outdoor learning
- Opportunities for outdoor learning
- Assessing risk outdoors
- Engaging children with local wildlife

Course Requirements

• Participants should be over 18 years old and have some experience of working with young people, for example teachers, teaching assistants, or other educators

• Attend the one day course and the 2 hour meet-up (these take place approx. one month apart)

- Submit some written recordings of learning
- Course commitment approximately 20 hours

Price £90

It is possible for the Introduction to Facilitating Outdoor Learning (level 1) to be delivered as INSET training. Attendees are required to be present at the 1 day INSET training day and to submit some written recordings of learning within 2 weeks of the date of training to receive the accreditation.



Leader in Outdoor Learning (Level 2)

This course is accredited by Open College Network and is designed to enable primary school staff and other educators to deliver curriculum-linked activities outdoors.

Course Description

3 days covering the following units:

- Benefits of Outdoor Learning
- Engaging children with local wildlife
- Health and Safety in the natural environment
- Learning in the natural environment
- Using and improving the school grounds and the natural environment

During the course you will gain:

- Experience of outdoor activity ideas for core and foundation subjects
- Knowledge of research demonstrating the benefits of outdoor learning
- Skills to maximise outdoor play for learning in break times
- Ability to improve your school grounds for learning
- Awareness of wider schemes and programmes to support you
- Skills for managing classes outdoors
- Awareness of good health and safety practice and appropriate risk taking
- Ideas for activities to support children's interest in local wildlife

Course Requirements

- Participants should be over 19 years old and have some experience of delivering a curriculum to young people, for example teachers, teaching assistants, or other educators
- All participants must be DBS checked
- Attend the three days of theory and practice
- Be able to plan and deliver at least three outdoor learning sessions
- Complete a workbook of evidence
- Course commitment approximately 70 hours
- Option to attend a monthly mentoring session (these are not compulsory but highly recommended)

Delivery

The three days is roughly an even mixture of theory and practical outdoor sessions. On the second day the group will visit a local school to learn more about how school grounds can be used and improved.

A bank of resources and ideas are held online for participants. Participants are required to document and deliver three outdoor sessions with their school and to complete a workbook of evidence for submission.

The course normally takes participants six months to complete although some have handed all the coursework in after a few months. It can take several months for the work to be marked and for the exam board to validate it and send certificates out.

What will I need for the course?

You will need a full set of outdoor waterproof clothing and a pair of suitable boots, as parts of the course will be spent outside whatever the weather. A camera/phone is advisable to take pictures for your future inspiration.

To complete your workbook of evidence you will need to plan and deliver 3 outdoor learning sessions in your setting.

You will be sent full joining instructions when you have booked a place.

How do I book a place?

Please complete the booking form included in this guide and return to us with a deposit to secure your place on a course. We will then invoice you for the remaining balance a month before the course starts. Payment must be made before the start of the course. See our booking conditions included in this guide.

What are the times?

The course runs over 3 days, usually from 9.30am until 4.30pm.

Can you come to us?

SWT can offer tailored Outdoor Learning courses at an individual setting or school if there are sufficient numbers of staff (six plus) wanting to attend. This is a great training opportunity as it enables you to have a course delivered that is specifically tailored to your site and the children or young people you work with. Adult courses booking conditions

Safety and first aid

All training activities run by the Surrey Wildlife Trust are run with safety as a priority, and all our tutors are First Aid trained. There will be safety instructions where necessary as part of the session, which we expect all participants to follow. Please inform the bookings administrator of any dietary requirements or medication taken. Please bring any medication needed and make the course leader aware of where it is.

Clothing and Equipment

All participants should be adequately prepared for the outdoors. Clothing should be suitable for getting muddy/torn.

Winter: warm clothes and waterproofs.

Summer: hats, suncream and plenty of water should be brought; waterproofs if it looks like it may rain.

We recommend long trousers and long sleeved tops, even in the summer, to help prevent bites, scratches and ticks. Insect repellent may be applied if you wish.

Footwear should be sturdy trainers or boots to reduce the likelihood of slips, trips and falls.

Inclement weather

Our training will run unless the weather is so bad it would be dangerous to do so (e.g. high winds). The sites we use have access to a building if necessary and have toilets available.

Refreshments

Where training lasts all day, please bring a packed lunch and a drink. Refreshments (tea and coffee etc.) are provided.

Refunds

Should it ever become necessary for the Outdoor Learning team to cancel a booking owing to circumstances outside the control of the Outdoor Learning Manager, for example because of severe weather, you will receive a full refund.

If you cancel more than 14 days before the training then you will receive a full refund.

If you cancel less than 14 days before the training you will be offered an alternative date if possible, but you will not receive a refund.

Variation of conditions

The Outdoor Learning team reserves the right to vary its booking conditions from time to time as necessary. Bookings will be subject to those conditions prevailing at the time of the issue of the booking form.

Outdoor Learning courses booking conditions

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Clothing and Equipment
