


Surrey Biodiversity Information Centre

- Works with organisations and individuals that produce or use biodiversity data either through their work or leisure activities.



Background

- Non-statutory (i.e. no legal protection),
- Protection <u>only</u> through the planning system,
- Many equal in quality to statutory Sites of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI),
- More than 40,000 Local Sites in England,
- Criteria for selection derived locally with reference to national site selection framework (DEFRA 2006),
- Aim to be Inclusive and comprehensive rather than representative (e.g. SSSIs).

SNCIs in Surrey

- Origin in 1975 Surrey Structure Plan
 - Areas of High Ecological Quality (AHEQ),
- Original surveys from mid-1990s onwards, managed by SWT in partnership with SCC and relevant LA,
- Identification and selection overseen by Surrey Nature Conservation Liaison Group (SNCLG),
- Renamed Surrey Local Sites Partnership (SLSP) in 2010,

SNCIs in Surrey

- SNCIs: **15,326** ha or **9.2**% of Surrey,
- pSNCls: 1,735 ha or 1.0% of Surrey,
- By comparison...

- Hampshire: 4000+,
- East Sussex: 340, West Sussex: 358,

- Greater London: 1,600+ (three tier system).

SNCI Selection Criteria

- Current version published in 2008 by Surrey Wildlife Trust,
- Based on DEFRA guidance with support of Surrey's specialist recording groups,
- Three parts;
 - General Guidelines (Ratcliffe Criteria),
 - Habitat Guidelines,
 - Species Guidelines,

SNCI Selection Criteria Review

- Revision & update long overdue,
- Needed to account for changes to legislation & conservation policies / priorities since 2008,
- Changes in species status both locally and nationally,
- Claire Gibbs (SWT Ecology Services) funded by SCC, SWT & SBIC,
- Issues considered included...
 - UK Habitat Classification,
 - Irreplaceable Habitats Guidance for Surrey,
 - Grassland Inventory,
 - Ancient Woodland Inventory,
 - Rivers.

SNCI Selection Criteria Review

- SWT ES review included;
 - Latest knowledge of the species group nationally and in Surrey
 - Updated SSSI Selection Guidance.
 - Wider Best Practice (e.g. other county's LWS selection criteria e.g. Hampshire / Devon)
- Species expert groups examined existing criteria and advised on applicability and/or measurability,
- Also advised on proposed changes,
- Draft Criteria passed to SLSP & SNP for formal signoff & adoption



17 Birds

Sites which meet the following criteria should be considered for selection;

- S32 Any site that holds 5% or more of the total Surrey breeding population and/or wintering population and/or migratory waterbird (includes wildfowl and waders) population of a single species.
- S33 Any site that holds 1% or more of the total Surrey breeding population of any UK Rare Breeding Bird species, as defined by the UK Rare Breeding Bird Panel.
- S34 Any site that supports species on the conservation concern list for Surrey categories 1-4 (devised by Surrey Bird Club, see table 7 – the species must be either breeding or wintering as specified in the table).
- S35 Any site which supports a breeding bird assemblage or wintering waterbird assemblage of county importance as indicated by table 10.

Justification

- 17.1.1 Sites supporting more than 10% of the Surrey population are important for the maintenance of the total county population.
- 17.1.2 The list of species of conservation concern within Surrey has been devised by Surrey Bird Club using the criteria shown in table 9.
- 17.1.3 Criteria S32 is intended to identify important assemblages of different bird species, characteristic of particular habitats, which are significant in a County context. Table 10 has been adapted, by Surrey Bird Club, from the guidelines regarding the selection of SSSIs (Drewitt, Whitehead, & Cohen, 2023), to identify sites that are likely to be of county importance within Surrey. The species points have been adjusted from the SSSI guidelines so that one point has been added for a species with a Surrey breeding population of 10 or less pairs. Half a point has been added for species with a Surrey breeding population of 11-20 pairs. The score for sites indicative of high quality habitat has been taken from the site threshold values in the SSSI guidelines and divided by 2 to indicate sites likely to be of county importance. The SSSI guidelines do not include a scoring system for winter waterbird communities. The scoring system for this community has been retained from the previous SNCI criteria for Surrey (Surrey Wildlife Trust, 2008).

Application

- 17.1.4 Bird data can be complex and require expert interpretation therefore sites should be considered on a case by case basis following advice from local experts such as Surrey Bird Club.
- 17.1.5 When considering criteria S29 & S30, evidence should be based on the last 5 years of published bird data (i.e. the last 5 Surrey Bird reports published) and sites should be judged on the average population over 5 years if known. If
